Sustaining Communities

Researchers at the University of Aberdeen have issued two articles which provide updates on continuing research within the CCN+ '[Everyday Life and Cultural Communities](#)' theme. The first of these looks at three different communities who have set up community broadband initiatives, asking how and why these initiatives take place in certain communities and what the implications are for community development ([Read more](#)). Researchers from the Open University of Catalonia (UOC), [Dr Sandra Sanz](#) and [Dr. Antoni Roig](#), attended the CCN+ meeting in Leeds, with the aim of getting involved with the Network and exploring possible interrelations, thus contributing to its future internationalization.

Sandra Sanz's main interests are knowledge sharing and expertise, with particular emphasis in communities of practice. She's currently defining a research project on communities of practice, expertise, austerity and social engagement through the case of the different communities of the Mortgage Victims' Platform, one of the most popular and controversial civic social organizations in Spain.

Antoni Roig's main interests are participatory media production, cross-media and innovation. He's currently working in a project aimed at the development of a community-based initiative for collaborative media production through co-creative strategies. This work is at the focus of his current research stay at the Music, Film and Media School of the University of Sussex.
